Half-Way Season Summary

The Lancer started in September on a four-game win streak. Then they lost 1-3 to Frontier. Against East Longmeadow, the Lancers lost 2-3. Since the loss, our Lancers have a three-game win streak recording wins against Agawam, West Side and Minnechaug.

For the ten games ending October 1, the Lancers are 8-2 and #2 in The Republican Fab Five. The Lancers have recorded 330 kills against the 10 opponents. Leading the Lancers offensively were Andrea Davis (112 Kills), Natalie Zucker (58 Kills), Lynsey Keator (52 Kills), and Caroline Martin (39 Kills). Natalie and Caroline lead in serving productivity. On defense, Lynsey Keator has tallied 14 total blocks out of a team total of 44. So far, Natalie Zucker (named Republican Athlete of the Week, September 22) registered 121 digs and 202 Ball Handling Assists to lead the Lancers. Andrea Davis was named AVCA high school player of the week for September 26 and leads the Lancers in Service Receiving at 126. These stat leaders along with Libero Jenna Carando, Christina Mentor and Hannah McGrath are "starters". Christina is out of the line up due to an injury and Anna McGann has filled the void. Coach goes to the bench for "secret weapons". Katelyn Boutin and Alison Donnelly are used as setters. Steph Lauria has made key serves. Desiree Santaniello, Steph Dionisi, Sara Underwood have subbed in for defense. While Olivia O'hara provides extra kill power upfront. All – in- all, the second half of the season looks like a winner.

QUESTIONS WITH JAY, FATHER OF SAM BURTON - THE GREATEST DIGGER IN LHS HISTORY!

Chicago – The Mintonette interviewed Jay Burton to find out how his daughter became the greatest digger in Lancer history. Sam Burton played volleyball at LHS (class of 2008) and holds the career record for Serve Receives (298) and Dig Saves (423). Also, Sam holds the record for Match Dig Saves (33) and Season Dig Saves (423). That's why Sam is the greatest digger in LHS history. Sam currently attends University of Chicago. (Note: Counting records began in the 2007 season)

Mintonette: What's a Digger?

JAY: A digger is any player who passes the ball with her forearms when the ball is spiked or attacked. (A dig is only recorded when a ball is successfully kept in play)

Mintonette: How did she learn to play?

JAY: Sam never played volleyball until summer volleyball camp before 9th grade. At LHS, Sam did not play many varsity games first year but the experience gained by practicing with varsity was immeasurable. Sam went to volleyball camps at Cornell, Bentley, and multiple times to Springfield College. She also played club volleyball every off season..

Mintonette: What made her the greatest?

JAY: Sam would probably say that she was only as good as the teammates around her. That she received great coaching along the way. Sam had a quiet determination to get to every ball and to win Western Mass. She always said that she never kept score; just played every point as if it was match point.

LANCER HEAD COACH FINALIST FOR AVCA MEDIA AWARD

LEXINGTON, Ky. – The American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) in June announced that George Mulry and www.LongmeadowVolleyball.com was an AVCA Grant Burger Media Award Finalists. Lancers to Play in Spalding Showcase of Champions Tournament

For the second year (out of the 2 years the tournament has been held) the Lancer have been invited to play in the Spalding Showcase of Champions Tournament being held at Holyoke Community College on October 10-13, 2008. The Volleyball Hall of Fame will host 30 girls' high school volleyball teams at tournament in the "birthplace of volleyball." The tournament includes the most competitive girls' volleyball teams from Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Maine, New Hampshire and New York.

The first Lancer match will be played Friday at 8 p.m. against Greely High School, Cumberland, Maine. The Rangers finished last season by winning their 49th consecutive match and were Maine State Champions. Play will continue for the Lancers on Sunday morning at 9 a.m. where Pool Play will begin. This Round Robin Tournament is structured with 2 six team round robin pools with playoff. Key Pool Play "A" competitors includes Andover High School, Burnt Hills (NY) High School, Frontier Regional High School, Milford High School and Salem (NH) High School. The winner of Pool Play "A" will play the winner of Pool Play "B". The complete schedule of events is available at www.volleyhall.org.



Also, the Showcase will present a skills competition for players on Saturday and Sunday between 12:30pm and 3:00pm. Skills Competition involves 4 players from each team (Best Server, Spiker, Passer, and Setter) competing in a 2 minute competition (30 seconds for each skill - serving, spiking, passing, and setting) This skills competition for volleyball is the equivalent of a home run derby or a slam dunk contest. This exciting event will showcase skills of one player from each team in a two minute competition using their skills of passing, setting, serving, and spiking, each for a 30-second span. Single day tickets are \$4 for Students and \$8 for Adults. Tickets will be available for purchase at the door. Also, weekend tickets are \$12 (adult) and \$6 (student).

The showcase is a part of the Hall of Fame Induction Celebration. The Induction takes place on Thursday, October 23. Six international greats will be inducted into the Hall of Fame for their contribution to the sport. In addition, the Volleyball Hall of Fame Reception and Dinner will be held at 6 p.m at the Log Cabin Banquet and Meeting House.
